No glaze ever comes out exactly as a previous firing. No construction is ever exactly the same twice. That is the nature of art and the nature of the organic processes involved in pottery.

Please understand that pricing is based on my skill as an artist and the time involved in creating a piece. Also understand that while a pound of clay and two dips in a glazing bucket are minor costs, the cost of equipment such as a potter's wheel and a kiln and firing that kiln are very expensive.

## Services

### Apprenticeship

One who wishes to apprentice will be provided guidance and short tutorials in both wheel throwing and hand building, have access to a wheel and space to build their own work, and access to a Cone 6 electric kiln. The apprentice will be exposed to all activities including maintenance in a typical ceramic studio and in return for access and lessons be expected to help with studio work including maintenance and cleaning. The apprentice will not create my forms, though there might be some supervised glazing.

### Introduction to Clay Art

1 1/2-Hour Introductory Lesson to wheel throwing	40
1 1/2-Hour Introductory Lesson to hand building or slab work	35

**Series of 4 or 6 Lessons** – wheel throwing: student will learn how to throw a 1 to 2-pound stoneware vessel, clean and alter it in its leather-hard stage, learn glazing techniques of bisque ware as well as safety when working with clay. Lessons are 1 1/2 hour.

Supplies include 5 pounds of clay and standard applications of glaze per bisqued vessel. Each pound after that is \$1. Items will be fired in a Cone 6. 125 - 180

### Couple's Date Night

#### For 2 people, up to 2 hours

Hand building and/or wheel throwing: Participants will experience throwing 1 to 2 pounds of clay on a wheel as well as hand-building. Your choice of vessel to make is limited by your imagination and our time!

Includes hor d'oeuvre tray and non-alcoholic beverages of your choice. BYOB. 75

#### For 4-6 people, 2 hours

Hand building projects. Possible projects include phone or perpetual calendar holders, charcuterie trays, butter slabs & spoon rests, toad abodes. Options are only limited by your imagination and our time!

Choice of 3 glaze options done by clay artist, fired and returned. 35/person
